

History of the CIOMR:

The CIOMR was established in 1947 as the official organization of Medical Reserve Officers within NATO. The CIOMR is a dynamic organization comprised of Reserve Officers Associations and invited guests from 22 NATO and partner nations.

CIOMR members include: Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Denmark, Estonia, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Slovenia, Spain, UK, and USA. Associate members are: Austria, Republic of South Africa, Singapore and Switzerland.

Organization:

The CIOMR is affiliated with the Confederation of Interallied Reserve Officers (CIOR) and holds its sessions at the same time and location as those of CIOR. An annual Mid-Winter Meeting and planning conference is held, usually at NATO Headquarters (Brussels, Belgium) in January/February each year and is followed by an annual Summer Conference in July/August, hosted by a NATO member or partner country.

The Association of Military Surgeons of the United States (AMSUS) is the official vehicle for US medical personnel for US involvement in the CIOMR.

Major Event:

The major event of the CIOMR is the annual Summer Congress. This congress includes a variety of activities, to include a formal 2-day Scientific Session, featuring presentations from members of the international military-medical community, for which continuing medical education credits can be awarded. The theme of presentations is usually known after the Mid-Winter Meeting (MWM), usually held in Brussels, Belgium. A portion of the scientific curriculum includes 'open presentations' if time permits.

Who May Participate:

Participation as a member of the US CIOMR Delegation is open to any medical member of US reserve organizations and AMSUS. Preference is toward AMSUS and ROA members. AMSUS is the administrative application gateway for Delegate and guest appointments to the US CIOMR Delegation, in close co-operation with the US CIOMR VP and Secretary General. AMSUS is the officially recognized US member of the International CIOMR, of which the US CIOMR is the US representative delegation.
